Agenda:	
1.	National MHANZ committee feedback AGM held on 22 May 2020 via Zoom – several Christchurch members attended. Minutes available on MHANZ website. Note that subscription to the American journal SPMH has been discontinued.
2.	 Feedback on lockdown issues Cubro continued to supply essential equipment as required (Helen Murray). High number of falls and deterioration of people during lockdown – this meant that plans required changing once physios able to visit. Residents in some facilities were being kept in bubbles within their room and not mobilising. Limited access by therapists to facilities – Kim reported she was able to see people in hospital level care (because she only works in one place). Reduced number of staff – higher numbers were off work because they were unable to work if feeling unwell for any reason.
3.	Transferring patients who have collapsed Prior to the meeting Jessie had circulated articles from UK Resuscitation Council; South Australian Government and an email from member of AAMHP. - Some instructions were difficult to interpret. - Different approaches were presented. - Many residents in aged care are not for resuscitation, so may be preferable to leave them in a chair and move to a quieter location. - Not a topic that has been requested for training. - Discussion about 'what if' scenarios for emergency evacuations requires more consideration e.g. fire evacuation procedures. - Important to stop and think about how to safely manage scenarios particularly because it is 'high stress situation'. - Principle-based approach is required, rather than prescriptive techniques. - Currently no NZ guidance – Jessie to make comment on MHANZ Forum. - Use of REBA score provides an evaluation of posture but Sue commented that it does not include all the criteria used in a typical REBA assessment.
